

Mini McQueens and Precision

Overview

Each competitor will shoot a Precision and a Mini McQueen series of shots. There are a total of 200 points per round; 100 Precision and 100 for McQueens.

Equipment Mini McQueens and Precision

Rifle – Any rifle chambered in 0.22LR semi-automatic or bolt action

Front Rest – A front rest or bipod may be used

Rear Rest – A soft bag or gloved hand can be used under the rifle butt

Sights – Scoped Rifle

Mini McQueens

Course of Fire

All targets are disruptive pattern and there are 9 positions where a target can be exposed. All target exposures are at a random position. Any target can appear more than once and not all positions may be presented, during the course of fire.

- The shooter is allowed a maximum 2 min and unlimited sighting shots on a separate sighting target
- The RO calls “With 10 rounds load and make ready”
- The RO calls “Is any shooter not ready”
- The start of the detail is indicated by the “no shoot flag” at the left of the target being withdrawn
- Random Delay between 20 & 25 seconds
- Sequence of 10 exposures of 3 seconds interspaced by a random delay between 10 & 15 seconds
- End of detail is indicated by presentation of the red “no shoot flag” to the left of the castle
- RO only calls “Cease Fire” only when the concurrent Precision series has completed

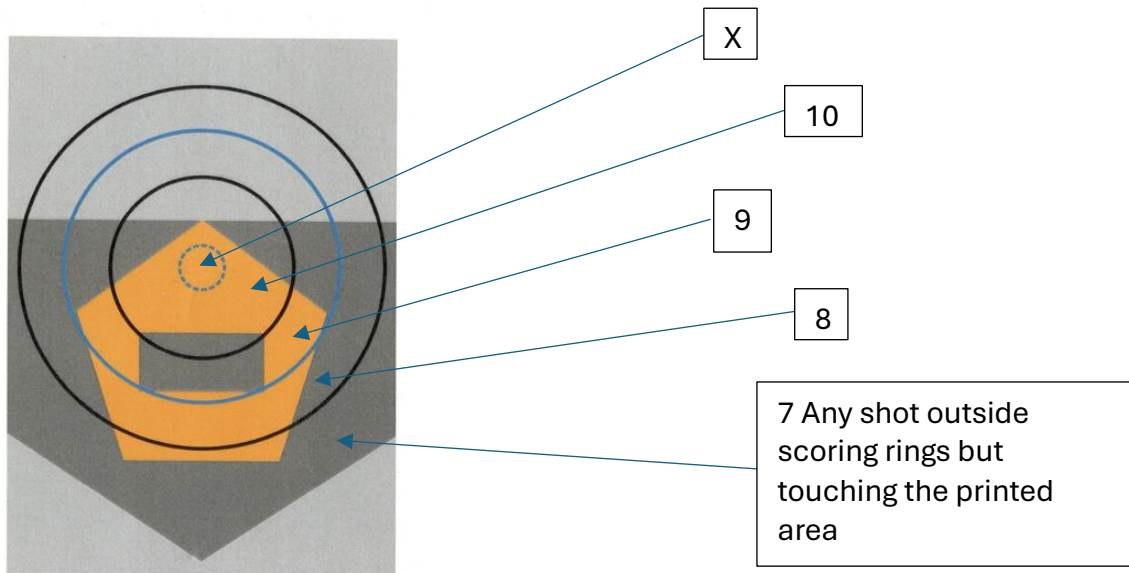
An average course of fire lasts around 5 minutes; sighters 2 min and 3 min on the turning targets.

Scoring¹

- All shots are inward scoring
- If more than 10 shots are located on the targets only the lowest 10 shots count

¹ For this competition unconventional scoring is used to equalise available points between the McQueens and the Precision part of the competition.

- Elongated holes caused by late shots fired while the target is turning, will be treated as follows:
 - Any horizontal hole > 1.5x the bullet diameter (8.4mm for a 22LR) score zero
 - Non horizontal, elongated holes are ricochets and score zero
 - Skid shots are scored by using a skid gauge or vernier caliper



Malfunctions Mini McQueens

In the case of a:

- Misfire - remain pointing towards the buttstop for 30 seconds and inform the RO
- Jam - a shooter may elect to, but does not have to claim a malfunction and clear the rifle themselves

A competitor experiencing a malfunction or misfire as agreed by the Club Official, is allowed to reshoot the remaining shots in the sequence.

- After the misfire or jam is cleared, the competitor will reload with the required number of rounds to finish the course of fire.
- RO restarts the target and manually stops it once 10 rounds in total have been fired.

Only one malfunction may be claimed per detail.

A target malfunction will result in a full reshoot for the competitor.

Precision

Targets

This competition will be shot on Bench Rest 50m 10 diagram targets (50M10BR17-18) with a single 50m sighting diagram consisting of a cut down (MM12C BR15-18).



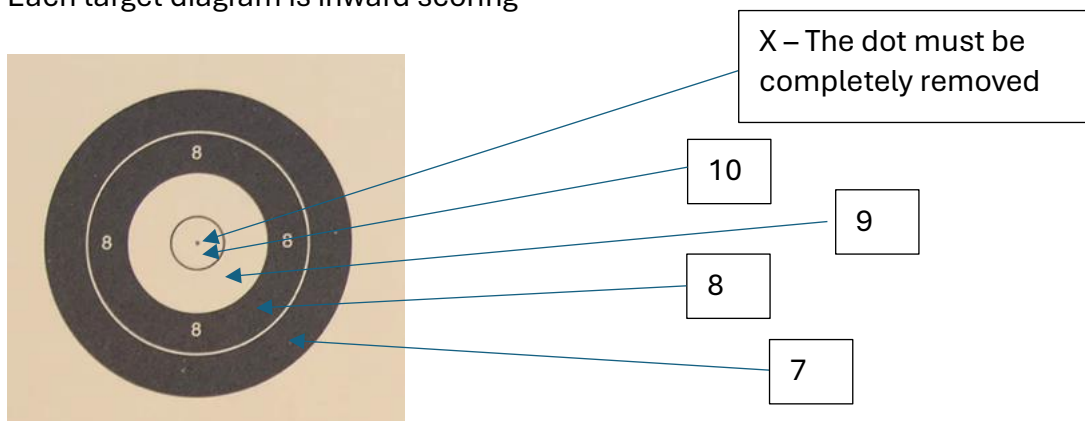
Course of Fire

The shooter has unlimited sighting shots on the sighting target, followed by 10 shots 1 shot on each diagram. A combined time of 5 minutes is allowed for the sighting and precision shots. The precision shoot will run concurrently with the McQueens detail.

- The RO calls “Load and make ready”
- The RO calls “Is any shooter not ready”
- RO will use a whistle to start and stop the detail
- The shooter has 5 mins to shoot their unlimited sighters and 10 deliberate shots one on each diagram
- At the end of 5 min the RO calls “Cease Fire”

Scoring

Each target diagram is inward scoring



- Any shot outside the aiming marks scores zero
- A one-point penalty will be applied for more than 1 shot on a diagram
- If more than 10 shots are located on the paper only the lowest scoring 10 shots will be counted

Malfunctions Precision

There are no malfunctions recognised for this competition and the shooter will be expected to clear any issues within the allotted time.

Range Safety

- All rifles will be brought to the firing point bagged
- Rifles may only be unbagged when ordered by the Range Officer
- No rifles must be touched when anyone is forward of the firing point
- Rifles must be pointed down range, (toward the targets) at all times
- Magazines may be pre-loaded but not inserted into the rifle until the command is given by the acting Range Officer
